Strategic Planning Cycle	 NZTR's strategic planning cycle has included recent meetings facilitated by David Cullwick, including meetings with: The Chairs and Chief Executives of the five largest racing clubs (Auckland Racing Club, Canterbury Jockey Club, the RACE Group, Waikato Racing Club and Hawke's Bay Racing in Auckland on 30 April 2014; Key stakeholder groups (NZ Trainers' Association, NZ Thoroughbred Racehorse Owners' Federation and New Zealand Thoroughbred Marketing) on 30 April 2014. The New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Association nominated delegate did not attend as he had forgotten about the appointment while the New Zealand Jockeys' Association did not send a nominee. The New Zealand Trainers' Association was represented by its Executive Officer, Wendy Cooper; Major Race Club Managers held in Wellington on 30 April 2014 (Auckland Racing Club, the RACE Group, Counties Racing Club, Taranaki Thoroughbred Racing, Avondale Jockey Club, the TRAC Group, Hawke's Bay Racing, Matamata Racing Club). a joint Waikato Racing Club and NZTR strategic planning session facilitated by David Cullwick on 22 May 2014. The meeting was a very positive engagement with another session scheduled in a month's time. South Island racing clubs and key stakeholder groups at Oamaru on 12 June 2014; Leading northern trainers at Cambridge on 13 June 2014; Leading Central Districts trainers at Awapuni on 18 June 2014. 	
NZTR Structure	As a result of resignations of the GM, Racing (David Jewell) and, a month later, the Manager, Racing Operations (Ross Gove) to take up positions in racing in Australia, NZTR has made some structural changes including creation of a new role of General Manager, Planning and Projects reporting directly to the CE. This role and the vacant role of GM, Racing have been advertised and interviews with short-listed candidates will be conducted shortly.	
Marketing Plan	A draft Marketing Plan has been considered by the NZTR Board. We have added a couple of graduates to the team to work on the digital side of the business, and we are also working with Delve Strategy as we look to overhaul core web and social media assets. On-course promotions will be managed by Janice Hill's on-course events team to work in conjunction with Clubs. A revamped, soon to be launched Social Racing is progressing well under the new management of Brent Cooper, with a 3-horse, paid-for offering to commence from 1 August 2014. The NZ Racing Desk is now feeding audio files and we'll look to add a video component in the future.

Thoroughbred Racing Archives	NZTR has contracted an archivist to assess the contents of the Racing Museum and other collections currently stored in containers at Ellerslie and Penrose, and provide recommendations on the wider issue of preserving and making use of NZ Thoroughbred racing's history.			
	This will consolidate the various collections stored in the three containers to determine what should be kept and what can be passed to the National Library or even discarded. This will also involve cross-referencing this collection with other collections including NZTR's own library and the NZTBA Stead Memorial Library (now in Arion Pedigrees' office in Cambridge).			
	Consideration will also be given to an online Museum with current and historical entries.			
	One example of how this can be done is the NSW State Library's <i>A Day at the Races</i> Collection, the digitisation of which was sponsored by Arrowfield Stud: <u>http://www.sl.nsw.gov.au/discover_collections/society_art/races/index.html</u> . Other examples of <i>Horseracing History Online</i> include: <u>http://www.horseracinghistory.co.uk/hrho/jsp/index.jsp</u> .			
	While the collection in Auckland contains a comprehensive range of reference material including books, magazines, photographs, prints and pictures, there is also a wide collection of objects such as one of the world's first automatic totalisator machines, riding scales, colours, caps, rugs, sashes, honour boards et cetera. These will be assessed separately for appropriate public display.			
Health Checks & Concussion Tests for Jockeys	NZTR is introducing Baseline Concussion Tests for all Jockeys . These will be conducted this year and then as required. The tests will be set up online by NZTR and Stewards will conduct the tests.			
101 30080 33	NZTR is also introducing Rider Health Checks for all Jockeys in 2014. These checks will be conducted by Jockeys' General Practitioners to an international Rider Health Check standard and paid for by NZTR. Subsequently Health Checks will be conducted biennially at licence renewal time.			
	These medical records will be stored in a confidential online environment to allow Stewards remote access on racedays in the event of an incident.

Rules 104 and 407: Definitions and Registration of Horses 2. Rule 333: Ownership of Horses by Rider 3. Rule 406: Registration of Horses 4. Rule 526: Eligibility of Horses for Races 5. Rule 616: Notifiable Gear 6. Rule 652: Pregnant Mares 7. Rules 104, 208, 322, 344 (new), 656-7, 803, 812 (new) & 902 - Drug and Alcohol Testing It is intended these will be in the Rules before the start of the new season.
