
A total of 20 Champions for the 2014-15 racing season are announced on the night culminating in The Award for Outstanding Contribution to Racing and The Horse of the Year Award.

Meeting details:

- 1. Racing Rotorua Wednesday meeting equivalent was run on the Monday prior last season.
- 2. Ashburton RC Friday meeting ran 10 races in FY15, 9 in FY14.
- 3. Taumarunui RC Saturday meeting ran 9 races this season, 8 last season.
- 4. Racing Te Aroha RC Sunday meeting equivalent was scheduled on the following Wednesday in FY14, but abandoned following storm damage to the racecourse; 9 races in FY15.

Turnover summary notes:

- 1. Total NZ thoroughbred turnover is up 2.5% year to date.
- 2. 10 less meetings and 36 less races have been run than to the same date last season.
- 3. Turnover per race is up 3.8%.
- 4. Total starts made by thoroughbreds in NZ are down 343, 1.2 % less.
- 5. Average field size is 10.452 in FY15, up from 10.440 (+0.12%) in FY14.
- 6. The number of races with less than 8 starters is 1 lower than the season prior (433 v 434).
- 7. The decline in NZ thoroughbred totalisator turnover (down 4.5%) has been offset by an increase in FOB turnover (up 24.7%).
- 8. Export turnover (\$NZ) is up 8.3% per race to 28 June.

Note: Turnovers are provided by the NZRB from various reports. On-course is totalisator turnover on the meeting and on intertrack meetings, plus FOB racing turnover on the meeting only (FOB intertrack is not provided from these reports at present). On-course self service turnover is also not currently included. Total NZRB racing turnover is all racing bet through the NZRB. NZ racing turnover is NZ thoroughbred, harness and greyhound turnovers combined; imported racing turnover is all imported thoroughbred, harness and greyhound turnover. Combined with sports, the racing turnover provides the total NZRB turnover. NZ thoroughbred export turnovers are stated in \$NZ, generally up to a week or two behind other turnover numbers.
