FROM THE HORSE'S MOUTH

Taranaki T.R.I. hosts a Premier 2 meeting on Saturday, the headline event being the \$65,000 Waikato Stud Opunake Cup. Last year, the Listed race produced Iamishwara before his subsequent Group One victory and top tier status. This year's edition will feature Thorn Prince, Queens Rose and North And South. The subsequent winner will be granted \$1000 in travel costs providing they start in the \$100,000 eStar 118th Winter Cup. The eight race card includes 112 acceptances competing for \$245,000 in stakes.

Also on Saturday, Waikato Racing Club will host five jumping events rounding out an eleven race card. In accordance with our open jumps policy, the open entry hurdle was divided into two separate Maiden Hurdles and one Restricted Open Hurdle due to high nominations. The Two Year Old set weight and penalties event was also divided. Please note due to these divisions, the first race is scheduled to start at 10.32am.

The Victorian Spring Carnival deadlines have been released. New Zealand trained thoroughbreds have had great success in recent years with Ocean Park, Sangster and Lion Tamer. Elite gallopers who have already announced intentions to target these races include Volkstok'N'Barrell, Mongolian Khan and Pondarosa Miss. OAMARU CUP DAY THIS SUNDAY

One of North Otago's most pleasurable social and sporting occasions. Oamaru Cup Day, featuring the the \$25,000 Oamaru Cup run over a mile, takes place this Sunday, 19 July.

Horse racing in Oamaru has a long and illustrious history. At the first Cup meeting on 12 March 1862 all seven races were won by horses owned by the Julius Brothers. If the same feat is achieved on Sunday, the owners can look forward to taking home a share of a record prize money pool of close to \$200,000.

Admission to the race day is free, and all ages are welcome to attend.

The annual Speights-sponsored, Punter of the Year Championship is free to enter and teams can be made up of any size (individuals are welcome too) but you must present a betting pool of \$400 at the beginning of the contest in order to participate. The Championships commence from Race 3 with the winning team taking home a cash prize of \$1000.

Meeting details:

- Matamata RC Wednesday meeting equivalent was run on the previous Monday last season.
- Stratford RC Thursday meeting equivalent was run on Friday two weeks earlier in FY14.
- South Canterbury RC Friday meeting ran 11 races this season, 8 last season.
- Whangarei RC Saturday meeting equivalent was run at Avondale in FY14.
- Wellington RC Saturday meeting ran 8 races this season, 9 last season.

Turnover summary notes:

- Total NZ thoroughbred turnover is up 2.7% year to date.
- 9 less meetings and 27 less races have been run than to the same date last season.
- Turnover per race is up 3.7%.
- Total starts made by thoroughbreds in NZ are down 231, 0.8 % less.
- Average field size is 10.447 in FY15, up from 10.428 (+0.18%) in FY14.
- The number of races with less than 8 starters is 6 lower than the season prior (437 v 443).
- The decline in NZ thoroughbred totalisator turnover (down 4.3%) has been offset by an increase in FOB turnover (up 24.9%).
- Export turnover (\$NZ) is up 7.9% per race to 5 July.

Note: Turnovers are provided by the NZRB from various reports. On-course is totalisator turnover on the meeting and on intertrack meetings, plus FOB racing turnover on the meeting only (FOB intertrack is not provided from these reports at present). On-course self service turnover is also not currently included. Total NZRB racing turnover is all racing bet through the NZRB. NZ racing turnover is NZ thoroughbred, harness and greyhound turnovers combined; imported racing turnover is all imported thoroughbred, harness and greyhound turnover. Combined with sports, the racing turnover provides the total NZRB turnover. NZ thoroughbred export turnovers are stated in \$NZ, generally up to a week or two behind other turnover numbers.
