FROM THE HORSE'S MOUTH

The second leg of the Hawke's Bay Triple Crown series is run this weekend. The \$200,000 Group One Windsor Park Plate features eight individual Group One winners. The track is currently a Dead 5, which brings plenty of runners into contention. Nashville will look to cement his status as New Zealand's finest miler. He was unlucky in the Makfi Challenge Stakes and has drawn barrier 12. He is a two-time Group One winner over the distance and the forecast is rainfall on Saturday. Seven out of his nine wins have occurred on Good to Dead tracks. He will remain tough to beat at \$6. I Do will prefer a soft track to vindicate her favoritism at 4\$.

New Zealand Champion Stayer Silent Achiever has been allocated a visitor's handicap of 56.5kg in the first release of Melbourne Cup weights. Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup winner Who Shot Thebarman has received 54.5kg and won convincingly at Flemington on Saturday. Puccini was also allocated 54.5kg and should be a worthy contender after a resounding Merial Mile success. Other notable New Zealand interests include:

NZTR & EQUESTRIAN SPORTS NZ EXPAND TIES PROGRAMME FOR 2014-15

The partnership between New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing (NZTR) and Equestrian Sports New Zealand (ESNZ) to recognise Thoroughbreds in Equestrian Sport (TiES) is being expanded this coming season across the disciplines of Eventing, Jumping, Show Hunter, Dressage, and a Para-Equestrian partnership.

This follows a successful inaugural 2013-14 TiES Championship, which finished in May (at the Taupo 3-Day Event) won by Citadelle and Claudia Wilson. Citadelle was formerly raced as Vintage Peak, trained by 2013-14 Champion Trainer Lisa Latta. Vintage Peak won twice and had 4 placings in 20 starts before being retired in 2009 and retrained for a successful equestrian career.

NZTR and ESNZ created the TiES programme as a joint initiative to increase opportunities for second careers for Thoroughbred horses retiring from racing and raise awareness of their adaptability. This initiative has also strengthened links between the Thoroughbred racing industry, the wider equestrian community and the public to stimulate uptake of exracehorses for second careers. Matthew Goodson, Chairman of NZTR, said: "Our ultimate goal is to achieve a balance between the number of horses leaving racing and the number of enthusiastic and suitable, new homes able to take on the responsibility of looking after a former racehorse."

All ESNZ-calendared shows will now be eligible for TiES competition points, but only registered classes will count. Points will be allocated to the first six placing Thoroughbreds within an eligible class.

To be eligible to compete in the TiES National Competition your Thoroughbred must be registered with Equestrian Sports New Zealand. To register go to: www.nzequestrian.org.nz/para-equestrian/news/2014/september/ties/

TiES Registration confirmation can take up to three weeks depending on the information supplied. Once confirmed you will be sent a TiES Passport where all your horse details can be recorded along with TiES points throughout the season. If you previously registered with TiES in 2013-2014 you do not need to do this again and a TiES Passport will be sent to you shortly.

The TiES Championship will conclude at the Horse of the Year Show and will be showcased on the Saturday night at Horse of the Year, with awards being presented for the best Thoroughbred in each discipline along with the overall TiES Champion for 2014-2015.

Meeting details:

- Waikato RC Wednesday meeting ran 11 races this season, 8 last season.
- Ashburton RC Friday meeting ran 6 races in FY15, 7 races in FY14.
- Rotorua –BOP HC Sunday meeting equivalent was on the following Friday in FY14; 8 races this season, 9 last season.

Turnover summary notes:

- Total NZ thoroughbred turnover is down 0.5% year to date.
- 3 less meetings and 10 less races have been run than to the same date last season.
- Turnover per race is up 2.8%.
- Total starts made by thoroughbreds in NZ are down 97, 3.1% less.
- Average field size is 10.03 in FY15, up slightly from 10.02 in FY14.
- The number of races with less than 8 starters is two less (50) than the season prior.
- The decline in NZ thoroughbred totalisator turnover (down 7.9%) is partly offset by an increase in FOB turnover (up 27.3%).
- Export turnover per race (\$NZ) is up 1.2% to 31 August.
