FROM THE HORSE'S MOUTH

A great weekend of racing ahead with 38 races attracting 500 acceptances, an average of over 13 starters per race.

The \$100,000 Chep Pallecon Solutions Counties Cup (G3), to be run at Avondale due to extensive remedial track work at Pukekohe Park, attracted 14 entries including many looking to continue the Cups series across the summer. The \$100,000 NRM/Auckland Thoroughbred Stakes Fillies & Mares 1400 (G2) boasts an exceptional field including The Filly, Fix and Pussy O'Reilly. Perhaps consistent mare Goldminer could break through a black type drought for Shaune Ritchie. The \$50,000 IMG Counties Bowl showcases the Return of Champion Two year old Ruud Awakening. She has been out of form since her dominant two year old season that included a win in the Karaka Million. She drew barrier two, which will allow her natural speed to sustain on the pace.

Day one of the Ready to Run sale (18-19 November) was strong with both the median and clearance rates up and the top price of the day, a son of boom sire Fastnet Rock, knocked down for NZ\$320,000 on behalf of Hong Kong buyer William Tai.

THE GREAT RDA HORSE DOODLE

New Zealand Riding for the Disabled (NZRDA) is pleased to announce the website launch of a new campaign – The Great RDA Horse Doodle, sponsored by Pet-n-Sur.

The Great RDA Horse Doodle campaign asks 30 diverse and well-known New Zealanders to 'doodle' their interpretation of a Horse onto a high-quality canvas, which are then auctioned off on TradeMe in late November with 100% of the funds raised going towards to the work of RDA in New Zealand.

The participants range from sporting stars such as Sir Mark Todd and Sean Fitzpatrick, to musicians and actors such as Jason Kerrison (lead singer of Opshop and judge on NZ's Got Talent) to TV presenters such as Mike and Toni (Seven Sharp). The campaign is not aimed at the participant's level of drawing ability or art skills, but about creating something fun and quirky. Some of the participants, including Dick Frizzell and Greg Broadmore (lead artist / designer for Weta Workshop), are accomplished artists, but many are not, so RDA is encouraging them to inject their personality into the doodle. The key message from RDA is to give it a go – just like RDA asks its disabled Riders when they climb onto a horse for the first time.

SPALATO IN TOP HONG KONG SPRINT ON SUNDAY

Trainer John O'Hara is hopeful of success for unbeaten five-year-old Spalato, who is part owned by racing photographer Trish Dunell, in Sunday's BOCHK *Wealth Management* Jockey Club Sprint (1200m) at Sha Tin. At home in Singapore he has won from 1000m to 2000m, clocking up six wins, including the SG1 Patron's Bowl (1600m) and the SG1 Singapore Derby (2000m).

His last start in the Luzerne Cup on 26 October produced a record time for the 1200m over Kranji's Long Course and a wide margin victory. Spalato made virtually all under James McDonald, and drawing clear for a four-length success from the previous record holder Faaltless. His winning time of 1m 08.15s was the same as the mark achieved by Hong Kong's Champion Sprinter Lucky Nine in this year's G1 KrisFlyer International Sprint.

Spalato will face the best Hong Kong has to offer on Sunday in the traditional lead-in to the LONGINES Hong Kong Sprint. Multiple G1-winning globetrotter Lucky Nine and this year's two Dubai heroes, the G1 Al Quoz Sprint victor Amber Sky and the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen winner Sterling City, lead the home defence. Also among the 14 engaged are last year's winner Charles The Great, and the emerging talents Aerovelocity and Peniaphobia.

Meeting details:

- Manawatu RC Tuesday (NZ Trotting Cup Day) meeting ran 8 races, last season the equivalent meeting ran 9.
- Matamata RC Wednesday meeting equivalent was run on the following Thursday last season; 9 races this year, 10 last year.
- Dargaville Racing Friday meeting ran 9 races in FY15, 7 in FY14.

Turnover summary notes:

- Total NZ thoroughbred turnover is up 2.1% year to date.
- 7 less meetings and 44 less races have been run than to the same date last season.
- Turnover per race is up 7.6%.
- Total starts made by thoroughbreds in NZ are down 347, 3.8% less.
- Average field size is 10.69 in FY15, up from 10.55 in FY14.
- The number of races with less than 8 starters is 25 less than the season prior (103 v 128).
- The decline in NZ thoroughbred totalisator turnover (down 4.1%) has been offset by an increase in FOB turnover (up 23.5%).
- Export turnover per race (\$NZ) is up 7.7% to 9 November.

Note: Turnovers are provided by the NZRB from various reports. On-course is totalisator turnover on the meeting and on intertrack meetings, plus FOB racing turnover on the meeting only (FOB intertrack is not provided from these reports at present). Total NZRB racing turnover is NZ thoroughbred, harness, greyhound plus all imported thoroughbred, harness and greyhound turnover; combined with sports this provides the total NZRB turnover. NZ thoroughbred export turnovers are stated in \$NZ, generally up to a week or two behind other turnover numbers.
