#### FROM THE HORSE'S MOUTH

The \$25,000 Rating 65 F&M race at Otaki with a \$20,000 Pearl Bonus was won stylishly by Dramatist. The stake of the race and bonus resulting had connections of DRAMATIST pocketing \$35,625 last Saturday.

In the R65 Rotorua Pearl Series Race, the bonus was just missed when Amber Rayne flew home, but couldn't quite pick up Golan Express. The next Pearl series events are at Counties Racing Club on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> October and Gore Racing Club Friday 31<sup>st</sup> October. I strongly encourage stakeholders to target these races and to enjoy the incentives. Thank you New Zealand Bloodstock for continuing the series.

It is a blockbuster weekend in New Zealand. There is no shortage of opportunities to invest in quality races with four hundred and seven acceptances and thirty one races across the country. The Cup Week "Prelude" meeting at Riccarton finishes at 6.36pm as additional races were added after the Ashburton abandonment. Five stakes races are programmed nationwide, with the \$70,000 TBS Thompson Handicap being a stand out. Puccini will look to earn support after a lackluster performance in the Livamol Classic. He is a Derby winner and is capable of winning.

New Zealand breeds finished 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3rd and 4<sup>th</sup> respectively in the \$3,000,000 Caulfield Cup. It took top class Japanese stayer Admire Rakti to reel Donna Logan trained Rising Romance, despite a brilliant tactical ride from James McDonald. New Zealand could go one better in the \$3,000,000 Cox Plate at Moonee Valley this weekend. Roger James trained Silent Achiever has drawn barrier 11 and is betting at \$11. Sacred Falls is heavily favored by punters at \$4.50 and will look to give ex-patriot Chris Waller his first Cox Plate success.

A special mention to Bounding, who contests a world class field in the \$1,000,000 Manikato Stakes on Friday Night. The race is at 11.45pm.

#### CHRISTMAS AT THE RACES DATES/VENUES 2014

The NZRB's highly successful Santa's Pick promotion will be returning to Christmas at the Races events in 2014 for another festive season. Last year over 115,000 people attended a Christmas at the Races event and for over 18,000 of them it was their first time ever at the races.

One horse will be chosen as Santa's Pick for each race at a Christmas at the Races event. No Santa's pick hat will be worn in any Black Type races. The horse chosen as Santa's Pick will be promoted on-course in collaboration with the Christmas Cracker bet.

NZTR is seeking the support of owners and trainers whose horse is selected as "Santa's Pick" to allow their cap to be replaced with a red & white one at the time jockeys leave the weigh out area. Most connections embraced the idea last year but naturally both the NZRB and NZTR fully respect the wishes of owners and trainers. If the National Racing Bureau receives any requests asking that the owner's cap be worn, then naturally this will be accommodated.

## THE CANTERBURY JOCKEY CLUB LABOUR WEEKEND MEETING

The Armadillo Stakes cements its place as a key lead up to the Sothys New Zealand 2000 Guineas® and the New Zealand Bloodstock 1000 Guineas®. The 1600 metre three-year-old feature will again be run for \$70,000 in 2014, \$20,000 above the standard stake for a Listed race.

The Christchurch Casino Spring Classic, the Listed open handicap over 2000 metres, has also been retained on Labour Weekend. The move is designed to enhance the quality of its field to protect its Listed status and provide an even more appealing pattern of staying races leading up to the 3200 metres of the 151st running of Christchurch Casino sponsored New Zealand Cup®. The race sits ideally now two weeks prior to the 2500 metres of the Gold Club Metropolitan Handicap which is itself one week prior to the NZ Cup®.

#### **REMINDER OF AMENDMENTS TO RULE 652 - PREGNANT MARE OR FILLY RACING**

Trainers are reminded of the requirement under Rule 652 (amended on 1 August 2014) to enter a filly or mare, under their care, which has been served by a stallion, through the Trainers Service Centre in the Gear Requests section by selecting '*Served*' and entering the date in the comments field report. This must be done within 7 days of that service.

Trainers are also required to report the outcome of a 42-day pregnancy test within seven days of the results of that test. If the test is positive select '*In Foal*' and enter the last date of service in the comments field report or if the test is negative select '*Not In Foal*'.

If a pregnant filly or mare subsequently slips or is otherwise found not to be pregnant the Trainer is required to report this by selecting '*Not In Foal*' and entering the date in the comments field report before the horse may participate in any Race or trial or jump out.

These amendments aim to improve compliance of Rule 652 and increase information to bettors, taking into account a filly's or mare's potential change of racing performance (better or worse) when in foal.

#### MAJOR TRACK UPGRADE AT THE COUNTIES RACING CLUB'S PUKEKOHE PARK

Racing will cease at Pukekohe Park after the trial meeting scheduled for 8 December and the extensive drainage work and track reconstruction will take place over the summer months. Lateral drains at a 45 degree angle will be placed every five metres around the track and the track will be graded to make the surface even the whole way around. A new irrigation system will be installed and the work should be completed to allow sufficient autumn growth to consolidate the grass. The work is being done in conjunction with NZTR who are jointly funding the operation with the Counties Racing Club. The remaining seven meetings originally scheduled for Counties for the 2014-2015 season will be transferred to other Clubs in the Northern Region.

#### Meeting details:

Avondale JC Wednesday meeting ran 9 races this season, 7 races last season.

Otaki-Maori RC Saturday meeting ran 10 races in FY15, 8 in FY14. Ashburton RC Saturday meeting was abandoned due to an unsafe racing surface after race 1; 10 races were run at the equivalent meeting last season.

#### Turnover summary notes:

Total NZ thoroughbred turnover is up 1.8% year to date.

6 less meetings and 36 less races have been run than to the same date last season.

Turnover per race is up 8.2%.

Total starts made by thoroughbreds in NZ are down 279, 4.5% less.

Average field size is 10.36 in FY15, up from 10.20 in FY14.

The number of races with less than 8 starters is 23 less than the season prior (86 v 109).

The decline in NZ thoroughbred totalisator turnover (down 4.6%) has been offset by an increase in FOB turnover (up 24.3%).

Export turnover per race (\$NZ) is up 8.4% to 12 October.

Note: Turnovers are provided by the NZRB from various reports. On-course is totalisator turnover on the meeting and on intertrack meetings, plus FOB racing turnover on the meeting only (FOB intertrack is not provided from these reports at present). Total NZRB racing turnover is NZ thoroughbred, harness, greyhound plus all imported thoroughbred, harness and greyhound turnover; combined with sports this provides the total NZRB turnover. NZ thoroughbred export turnovers are stated in \$NZ, generally up to a week or two behind other turnover numbers.
