### FROM THE HORSE'S MOUTH

September marks the first day of spring, but is also the start of Stallion services. Stud staff will be working overtime to ensure our future champions will have the best possible start.

The Christchurch Cup Carnival received the first set of nominations on Tuesday. The \$400,000 2000 Guineas received 105 nominations. The race produced top class sire Darci Brahma and we look forward to the progeny of previous winners Jimmy Choux, Rock 'N Pop and Sacred Falls (Active) in the years ahead.

It was pleasing to see 117 nominations for the 1000 Guineas. Racing a filly in New Zealand is increasingly lucrative with incentives such as the NZTR F&M Bonus and NZB Insurance Pearl Series offering additional prize money pools. The New Zealand Cup and Couplands Bakeries Mile attracted 73 and 43 nominations.

The Melbourne Cup nominations were also due on Tuesday. Locally-trained horses include Silent Achiever, Puccini, Deane Martin, Costume, Colonel Carrera, and Sangster. Former locals include Kirramosa, Who Shot Thebarman and Lucia Valentina. After a promising effort in the New Zealand Bloodstock Memsie Stakes, Champion Stayer Silent Achiever looks our best cup chance since Xcellent. A Melbourne Cup victory has eluded champion sire O'Reilly to date.

This weekend includes a triple header race card from Ellerslie, Wanganui and Riccarton. The legendary Great Northern day will be on most punters schedules. The 4 mile (6400m), 25-jump contest, with the Ellerslie hill climb featuring three times, is one of the great tests of stamina and fitness in Thoroughbred racing anywhere in the world. Since 1999, Ann Browne has won the great race five times.

### SUCCESSFUL INAUGURAL DAFFODIL RACE DAY

The inaugural Daffodil Race Day raised \$20,000 for the Hawkes Bay Cancer Society. The Chittick family and winning trainer Alan Sharrock donated a percentage of their mare I Do's winnings from the Group One Makfi Stakes to the cancer society, Westbury stud donated a stallion service and all proceeds of admission were donated to the cause.

The TAB also provided a \$1 donation for every Fixed Odds Win and place bet on 'I Do' and 'Silent Achiever' in Melbourne, taking the total funds raised on Daffodil Race Day to \$20,000.

The target for her is to be competing in the 3yo filly races at Ellerslie over Xmas such as the Eight Carat and Royal Stakes.

Sisterhood ran an excellent 2<sup>nd</sup> placing in her 800m trial at Te Teko on 20 August. As with her first trial, she was lost for early speed but powered home late. This is likely to be her pattern of racing and she will excel once she steps up to longer distances. Team Hawtin will look for a suitable race for her over the next couple of weeks in which to make her race day debut. Meeting details:

- Matamata RC Wednesday meeting ran 8 races this season, 6 last.
- Egmont RC Thursday meeting ran 9 races in FY15, was abandoned after 3 races in FY14 due to persistent rain and surface water.
- Ashburton RC Friday meeting ran 7 races this season, 8 last.
- Whangarei RC Saturday meeting ran 10 races in FY15, 8 races in FY14.
- Te Aroha Racing Sunday meeting was abandoned after 3 races due to high winds; the equivalent meeting ran 6 races on the following Friday last season.

Turnover summary notes:

- Total NZ thoroughbred turnover is down 0.5% year to date.
- 2 more races have been run than to the same date last season.
- Turnover per race is down 1.5%.
- Total starts made by thoroughbreds in NZ are down 51, 2.5% less.
- Average field size is 9.84 in FY15, down from 10.19 in FY14.
- The number of races with less than 8 starters is 9 higher than the season prior.
- The decline in NZ thoroughbred totalisator turnover (down 8.5%) is partly offset by an increase in FOB turnover (up 30.9%).
- Export turnover per race (\$NZ) is down 2.9% to 24 August.
