The Racing industry lost one of its sons on Tuesday. Steven John Anderton will be greatly missed. He was the trainer of Group One Winning mare The Jewel, who achieved outstanding success in the North Island and Australia. He was relatively young for a trainer and The Diamond One will be a sentimental favourite in the \$70,000 White Robe Lodge In Memory of Steve Anderton Handicap. Our thoughts are with his wife Claire and two children.

Waikato R.C. International Day showcases a plethora of features. The \$300,000 Group One Herbie Dyke Stakes includes a showdown between Soriano and Shuka. The \$200,000 NRM Sprint is always a highlight. The race has past winners of the Telegraph, 2000 and 1000 guineas and over the distance of 1400m, the race should provide an exciting finish. The \$100,000 Cambridge Stud Sir Tristram Fillies Classic has a distinguished list of past winners that include King's Rose, Katie Lee and Zurella. The race features star fillies Platinum Witness, Saavoya, Vavasour and Tavy. Platinum Witness will look to continue her dominating form in the New Zealand Bloodstock Filly of the Year series. She currently leads the series at 18 points, while rival Saavoya is second at 16.

TV3 New Zealand Derby and Wellfield New Zealand Oaks 2nd withdrawals were processed at the National Racing Bureau this week. The TAB have adjusted their fixed odds markets accordingly, derby highlights include: Volkstok'n' barrell \$2.50, Mongolian Khan \$5, Gaultier \$10 and Rockfast \$12.

The Karaka sales finished on Sunday with 1364 lots catalogued this year, 898 were sold for \$67,388,650, an increase in the overall average (3%) of \$75,043. The median also held strong at \$45,000. The clearance rate stood at 75%.

Steve Anderton trained last year's White Robe Lodge winner, The Diamond One and the talented 5-year-old mare is attempting to secure back to back successes. Leading New Zealand apprentice, Rory Hutchings, who has ridden 42 winners this season, is booked to take the ride.

Meeting details:

- Hawke's Bay RI Thursday meeting ran 8 races this season, 7 last season.
- Taranaki TRI Friday meeting equivalent ran on a Sunday in FY14; 8 races this year, 7 last.
- Otago RC Saturday meeting was abandoned after race 1 due to the state of the track. The meeting was postponed until Waitangi Day. 10 races were run in FY14.

Turnover summary notes:

- Total NZ thoroughbred turnover is up 1.7% year to date.
- 9 less meetings and 45 less races have been run than to the same date last season.
- Turnover per race is up 4.7%.
- Total starts made by thoroughbreds in NZ are down 427, 2.6% less.
- Average field size is 10.57 in FY15, up from 10.54 in FY14.
- The number of races with less than 8 starters is 14 less than the season prior (222 v 236).
- The decline in NZ thoroughbred totalisator turnover (down 4.6%) has been offset by an increase in FOB turnover (up 21.8%).
- Export turnover per race (\$NZ) is up 9.1% to 25 January.

Note: Turnovers are provided by the NZRB from various reports. On-course is totalisator turnover on the meeting and on intertrack meetings, plus FOB racing turnover on the meeting only (FOB intertrack is not provided from these reports at present). On-course self service turnover is also not currently included. Total NZRB racing turnover is NZ thoroughbred, harness, greyhound plus all imported thoroughbred, harness and greyhound turnover; combined with sports this provides the total NZRB turnover. NZ thoroughbred export turnovers are stated in \$NZ, generally up to a week or two behind other turnover numbers.
