FROM THE HORSE'S MOUTH

It was a memorable weekend at Royal Randwick for New Zealand trained and bred horses. Mongolian Khan notably completed a dual derby double that has not been achieved since the legendary Bonecrusher. The son of Holy Roman Emperor sold at the New Zealand Ready to Run sale for \$220,000 will now attempt to emulate Phar Lap by targeting the Melbourne Cup. Current trainer premiership leading Baker/Forsman and the Mongolian Inner Rider Horse Group were the winning connections. The partnership also produced a quinella with Diademe and Sports Illustrated in the \$200,000 Fiber Fresh NZ Thoroughbred Breeders Stakes at Te Aroha.

New Zealand bred Kermadec (Teofilo - Hy Fuji) won the world's richest mile race, the \$3,000,000 Doncaster Handicap for Sydney based kiwi trainer Chris Waller. Impressively, New Zealand bred horses have won 7 out of the last 8 Doncaster Handicaps. The general consensus of New Zealand exclusively breeding stayers might be misplaced.

LONGINES WORLD'S BEST RACEHORSE RANKINGS

Hong Kong star **Able Friend's (AUS)** victory in the Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup (G1) is the effort that vaulted him to the top of the rankings. The gelding has won his last five starts, including additional Group 1 scores in the Longine's Hong Kong Mile and Stewards' Cup. On 7 April, he added the Chairman's Trophy (G2) to his list of laurels.

Earlier this year, **Shared Belief (USA)** took both the Santa Anita Handicap (G1) and the San Antonio Invitational (G2) in dominant fashion. In the San Antonio, he defeated America's 2014 Horse of the Year **California Chrome (USA)**.

Solow (GB) is now ranked third off of his impressive victory in the Dubai Turf sponsored By DP World (G1) on the Dubai World Cup undercard at the end of March. It was the 5-year-old gelding's first attempt at a Group 1 race, and he passed the test with flying colours, leaving **The Grey Gatsby** to check-in second 4 ¼ lengths behind him.

Sprinter **Brazen Beau (AUS)** is the highest-rated 3-year-old in the rankings after his victory in the Lexus Newmarket Handicap (G1), which featured a field including the likes of **Terravista**, **Chautauqua** and **Lankan Rupee (AUS)**.

Other newcomers to the top of the rankings include **Dolniya (FR)**, **Prince Bishop (IRE)** and **Flintshire (GB)**, after they all put in notable performances in Dubai. **Dolniya** took on males and defeated them in the Dubai Sheema Classic presented by Longines (G1), which she won over **Flintshire**. Meanwhile, **Prince Bishop** beat **California Chrome** in the Dubai World Cup (G1).

Meanwhile in Japan, **Gold Ship (JPN)** put in a strong effort to take the Hanshin Daishoten (G2) for the third time.

Looking forward, well-regarded 3-year-olds Dortmund (USA), Mubtaahij (IRE) and American Pharoah (USA) all

appear to be headed for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) after their exploits this spring.

JCA PENALTY GUIDE

The new JCA Penalty Guide will come into effect on 1 May 2015.

The JCA completed the stakeholder consultation process and the Guide has been approved by the JCA Board. The parties consulted included the JCA panelists, RIU, NZTR , HRNZ, Jockeys' Association, Trainers' Association, and Trainers' & Drivers' Association.

The JCA has drawn particular attention to the use of the whip starting point changes (Rule 638 (3) (b)) and the position for careless riding for South Island riders (Rule 638 (1) (d)) as well as the starting points for Rules 534(2) - Scratching Horses; 606 - Riders Present; 610 & 614 - Identification, Racing Gear and Riding Gear; 636 - Running Races; and 649 - Weighing -in. The Guide provides explanations of the above including 'starting points.'

RULE	OFFENCE DESCRIPTION	STARTING POINT (FINE OR SUSPENSION)
Rule 534 (2)	Scratching after 7.30am	\$400 fine - no horse denied a start
(b)	deadline	\$600 fine - horse denied a start (previously \$400 fine)
Rule 606	Rider leaving Jockey's area or racecourse without permission	\$300 fine (new)
Rule 610 (4)	Rider wearing modified body protector	\$600 fine (new)
Rule 614 (2)	Neglect in saddling	\$750 fine - where there are consequences for bettors & owners, or horse or rider safety; \$50 fine - incorrect saddlecloth; \$200 fine - affixing gear incorrectly; \$300 fine - omitting a towel; \$500 fine - failing to attach a lead bag (previously \$750 fine for neglect in saddling)
Rule 636 (1) (d)	Failure to ride out to the end of a race	1^{st} place - 5 weeks; 2^{nd} - 4 weeks; 3^{rd} - 3 weeks; 4^{th} - 2 weeks; 5^{th} - \$300 fine; 6^{th} - 10^{th} - \$350 fine (previously 3 calendar weeks with regard to placing). In regard to the lower fine for 5^{th} place compared to 6^{th} - 10^{th} places, for the few races where there are stakes for 6^{th} - 10^{th} place, these stakes in dollar terms are significant and invariably much higher than the stake for 5^{th} in all other races.

Meeting details:

- Taranaki TRI Thursday meeting equivalent was run two weeks later last season; 8 races were run this season, 9 last season.

- Riverton RC Easter Saturday meeting equivalent was run two weeks later in FY14; 11 races in FY15, 10 in FY14.

Turnover summary notes:

- Total NZ thoroughbred turnover is up 1.8% year to date.

- 10 less meetings and 51 less races have been run than to the same date last season.

- Turnover per race is up 4.4%.

- Total starts made by thoroughbreds in NZ are down 576, 2.7% less.

- Average field size is 10.35 in FY15, down from 10.38 (0.2%) in FY14.

- The number of races with less than 8 starters is 4 lower than the season prior (331 v 335).

- The decline in NZ thoroughbred totalisator turnover (down 5.3%) has been offset by an increase in FOB turnover (up 24.1%).

- Export turnover (\$NZ) is up 8.5% per race to 22 March.

Note: Turnovers are provided by the NZRB from various reports. On-course is totalisator turnover on the meeting and on intertrack meetings, plus FOB racing turnover on the meeting only (FOB intertrack is not provided from these reports at present). On-course self service turnover is also not currently included. Total NZRB racing turnover is all racing bet on through the NZRB. NZ racing turnover is NZ thoroughbred, harness and greyhound turnovers combined; Imported racing turnover is all imported thoroughbred, harness and greyhound turnover. Combined with sports the racing turnover provides the total NZRB turnover. NZ thoroughbred export turnovers are stated in \$NZ, generally up to a week or two behind other turnover numbers.
