# Update of Monday & Tuesday Scheduling Performance to 24 April 2012

After eight weeks of the new structure of Monday and Tuesday racing, results remain encouraging.

- Field sizes have increased marginally on Mondays from 8.6 to 9.0 and on Tuesdays from 9.1 to 10.8
- Off-course totalisator sales per race have increased on Mondays by 3.7% from \$47,046 to \$48,190 and on Tuesdays by 2.8% from \$61,607 to \$63,315
- Domestic fixed odd sales per race have increased on Mondays by 21% from \$14,327 to \$17,392 and on Tuesdays to \$20,000
- Export sales have remained steady on Mondays at \$90,699 and have increased on Tuesdays by 8.5% from \$90,219 to \$97,933

### NZTR Handicapping Review – May 2012

In early 2011 NZTR instituted a detailed Review of its Handicapping policies and procedures. The Review identified a number of key changes that were formally adopted by the NZTR Board and implemented on 14 November 2011. The NZTR Board made a commitment to monitor the changes including six monthly reviews.

NZTR now invites submissions and recommendations from industry participants on any aspect of the Review outcomes and the changes that were introduced in November.

NZTR will also be consulting with various sector groups in May including the three Regional Programming Committees, Racing Clubs, NZ Trainers Association, NZ Thoroughbred Breeders Association, NZ Jockeys Association, NZ Racehorse Owners Federation and the New Zealand Racing Board.

As part of your response please provide any supporting statistics, comments or examples of your viewpoint. If you wish, you might also like to provide a response to the following questions:

- > Has the current NZTR Programming and handicapping system worked for you, and why?
- > What parts of the current system do not work, and why?
- What would you change, and why?

Amongst the handicapping/rating issues that have been already been identified are weight penalties for horses racing out of their class, horses being re-rated out of their class for placings and the order of entry into Open Group One races for 3YO's.

### Strong Kiwi Contingent for Brisbane Racing Carnival

This year's Channel Seven Brisbane Racing Carnival is shaping up to be a Trans-Tasman clash like no other, with 25 New Zealand horses due to have arrived in Brisbane today, including the Wellfield NZ Oaks winner Artistic.

Artistic is an invitee for the Australasian Challenge, a new initiative designed to attract Australasia's best racing champions to the Brisbane Racing Carnival.

Artistic's trainer, Shaune Ritchie, said the new initiative certainly sealed the deal for them. "The generous offer to cover Artistic's travel expenses definitely confirmed our attendance at the carnival" he said. "Having the best three-year-old fillies from Australasia in the one event can only be good for racing."

Eighty seven horses, including Artistic, were nominated for the Group 1 Treasury Casino Queensland Oaks. A total of 105 horses have signed up for the Group 1 AAMI Stradbroke.

A million dollar prize is up for grabs in the Group 1 AAMI Stradbroke Handicap and at this point local horses Buffering and Woorim are favourites. Queensland's top trainer, Robert Heathcote, has nominated four horses for the top race and admits that his work will be cut out for him at this year's carnival.

This year's Channel Seven Brisbane Racing Carnival will take place at Doomben and Eagle Farm Racecourses between 12 May and 9 June.

Overall turnover was up 3.4% (+\$1.11m) last week on the same week last year.

Racing turnover was up 1.0% (+\$273k) for the week, with Domestic racing down 11% (-\$1.95m).

Domestic thoroughbreds turnover was down 10.4% (-\$994k) (tote + fob) with an additional meeting but six less races (-8.3%) with horse starts also down 23.2%.

Import turnover was up 21% on the same week last year (+\$2.22m).

Note: NZRB supplied On-course Turnover total represents On-course turnover placed on NZ thoroughbred meetings from all on-course venues. 'Total' NZ Thoroughbred turnover figure includes Off-course (including Pick 6), On-course (NZRB figure as commented above) and all Fixed Odds Turnover. All Turnover figures are supplied by the NZRB.
