Racing Safety Fund Open for Applications

The Minister for Racing Nathan Guy has announced that applications for the next round of the Racing Safety Development Fund are now open.

"This Fund supports projects that improve facilities and upgrade the safety standards at racecourses," says Mr Guy.

"All racing clubs and the racing code bodies are invited to submit applications for funding, with \$508,826 available in this second round from a total figure of \$1 million for 2011/12.

"Racecourse health and safety continues to be an important issue for the industry. This funding will help protect the health and safety of riders, spectators, officials, and animals. It also includes the standard of racecourse facilities and equipment.

"All racing clubs and the racing code bodies should be proactive in dealing with health and safety. The Fund is there to encourage and support their efforts."

There are around 150 racing clubs racing at nearly 70 racecourses around the country.

The Minister for Racing has written to all racing clubs and the racing code bodies inviting applications to the Fund. Applications must be submitted by 5 pm on 31 March 2012.

Overall TAB turnover was up 14.5% (+\$3.96m) last week on the same week last year. A major contributing factor to this was Waitangi Day falling on a Monday this year compared to a Sunday last year, with Monday growing by \$3.12m alone. Racing was up 11.4% (+\$2.81m) for the week.

Domestic thoroughbreds turnover was up 21.7% (+\$1.37m) with an additional meeting and ten more races, with horse starts up 23.6%. The features of the week (and top betting races) were the two Group 1's from Te Rapa, the Darci Brahma International (won by Shez Sinsational) with turnover (tote and FOB) of \$359k which was down 6.3% on last year (\$383k), and the Waikato Draught Sprint (won by Veyron) with turnover of \$352k, 33% down on last year (\$523k) with this race having 8 starters this year compared to 11 starters last year.

FOB Racing was up 41% (+\$1.16m) last week (up 41% or \$834k domestically), with just 20 more options (+4.5%) available than in the same week last year.
