### From the Horse's Mouth

NZTR is developing a new hierarchal structure of meetings and prizemoney, with a focus on lifting minimum prizemoney levels at the top 20 "premier" race meetings and "feature" race meetings.

NZRB's improved trading performance is likely to provide NZTR with capacity to increase certain categories of prizemoney from 1 January 2014.

In the upcoming 2013-14 racing season NZTR plans to:

- Schedule 364 race meetings (366 in FY13) with seven additional Saturday race meetings, four additional Sunday race meetings and thirteen less Tuesday race meetings;
- Schedule 2,955 races (3,069 in FY13);
- Increase minimum prizemoney levels from 1 January 2014 for the:
  - Top 20 "premier" race meetings;
  - Rating 65, rating 75 and rating 85 races at all 92 "feature" meetings ; and,
  - o Group 2 events.
- Provide special interest funding for:
  - Two new race series;
  - Up to four black type development races;
  - A national Country Cup series.

Further details will be set out in NZTR's strategic plan which will be finalised once the NZRB's 2013-2014 Statement of Intent and budget forecasts are released.

## Rangiora

At its meeting on 11 June 2013 the NZTR Board considered a proposal to recommence racing at Rangiora racecourse on 6 June 2014 under certain conditions.

The Board has asked management to convene a meeting with the Racing Integrity Unit, the New Zealand Jockey's Association and the Canterbury Jockey Club with the aim of reaching an agreed position which would be considered by the NZTR Board at its next meeting on 4 July 2013.

## New Commentary Line-Up for New Season

Up-and-coming talent will join the country's premier race-callers as part of changes to Trackside's commentary line-up for the 2013/14 racing season.

The new season, commencing August 1, will see changes to Trackside's team with a view to realigning the core premier calling team and further developing the next generation of New Zealand race-calling talent with guidance from established veterans.

George Simon, an internationally-renowned caller with a career spanning more than 20 years, will take the reins as the North Island's premier thoroughbred racing commentator. Aaron White has been elevated to call the North Island's premier harness meetings, including those at Alexandra Park.

Mark McNamara remains as the voice of the South as caller at premier thoroughbred and harness meetings in the South Island.

Trackside's first Broadcasting Cadet, Tom Wood, will take a big step in his career by leaving Dunedin to become a regular caller on the Central Districts circuit. Wood will be mentored by Simon. South Island caller Dave McDonald will take on the Dunedin area in Wood's absence while a recruitment drive is undertaken.

After a long and successful commentating career, Mike O'Sullivan will step aside from regular commentating duties in the new season. O'Sullivan will continue to be an integral part of the Trackside team as an announcer on Radio Trackside and will also continue to call trials in the Central Districts and provide support to Wood and the wider team.

A new Broadcasting Cadet will be joining the Christchurch-based team under the guidance of Mark McNamara.

#### Central Region Venue Changes – Otaki-Maori RC Racemeeting 21 June and Trials Meeting 25 June

#### Friday 21 June 2013 - Was Otaki, Now Trentham

Following a request from the RACE Group the Otaki Maori RC race meeting on Friday 21 June will be run at Trentham, not Otaki. The licence will remain with Otaki Maori RC and only the venue is changed.

After an inspection of the Otaki track it was recommended that the licence be shifted to allow for consolidation of the new drainage work that has recently been completed past the winning post and around the bottom turn. While this work has been completed on schedule, due to the recent wet weather experienced it is believed that the track needs more time to fully recover.

## Tuesday 25 June 2013 - Was Otaki, Now Foxton

The trials on Tuesday 25 June originally programmed for Otaki have been transferred to Foxton. The change has been made to facilitate the ongoing drainage work on the track at Otaki.

Nominations for the trials close at 12 noon, Monday 24 June.
