NZTR Producing A Three-Episode Pilot TV Programme Series On Racing

New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing, in conjunction with the social media company Socialize, is producing a three-episode pilot TV programme series that will take you inside New Zealand's thoroughbred racing industry.

The series will offer a rare behind-the-scenes insight into the lives of some of New Zealand racing's leading personalities.

The three episodes kick off on Wednesday 18 April 2012, and will be shown on the Trackside channel, Sky 36, at the following times:

Episode 1 7.30 pm on Wednesday, 18 April 2012 Episode 2 7.30 pm on Wednesday, 25 April 2012 Episode 3 7.30 pm on Wednesday, 2 May 2012

The pilot series will follow the fortunes of racehorse trainer John Bary and his Telecom New Zealand Derby winner, Jimmy Choux; Trelawney Stud; and jockey, Lisa Allpress.

NZTR Chief Executive Greg Purcell said: "This is an exciting development for the thoroughbred industry and we will be looking at options to produce a regular series in the future."

Patrick MacFie from Socialize added: "There are just so many interesting characters and incredible tales to tell in New Zealand thoroughbred racing and we're really excited to have the opportunity to get in behind the scenes and tell these stories."

NZTR has been working with Socialize to develop video content for publication on the NZTR Facebook and Twitter pages. In addition to the three above-mentioned subjects, a number of 3-minute videos have been produced and posted onto the NZTR Facebook page. These have included videos on James McDonald, Stephen Marsh and Graham Richardson.

Overall turnover was up19.4% (+\$5.60m) last week on the same week last year (+\$4.82m on Easter Monday), +4.0% season to date. Racing turnover was up 21.8% (+\$5.27m) for the week.

Domestic thoroughbreds turnover was up 27.5% (+\$1.67m) with the two extra meetings and eight more races (+13.6%) with horse starts also up 15.5%. Import tote was up 20.3% on the same week last year (+\$1.85m). Overall 100 more races were taken last week (+11.8%), with 60 North American races taken, including 11 harness races. FOB Racing, with 241 Final Field Place options offered (\$901k), was up 66.2% (+\$1.85m) last week.

Note: NZRB supplied On-course Turnover total represents On-course turnover placed on NZ thoroughbred meetings from all on-course venues. 'Total' NZ Thoroughbred turnover figure includes Off-course (including Pick 6), On-course (NZRB figure as commented above) and all Fixed Odds Turnover. All Turnover figures are supplied by the NZRB.
