NZTR National Fillies and Mares Series

As part of New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing's strategy to reposition the industry, a new National Series of restricted class Fillies and Mares races have been programmed to commence from 1 March, 2012.

A total of 30 \$12,000 midweek races for Fillies and Mares will be scheduled between March and the end of the current season.

NZTR Chief Executive Greg Purcell said: "The NZTR Board is committed to developing opportunities for fillies and mares long term and NZTR will continue to work with the Clubs and the Regional Programming Committees to provide a schedule of 80 \$12,000 midweek Fillies and Mares races nationally in the 2012-13 season."

Across a full season it is envisaged that there will be a minimum of \$1.2 million in advertised prizemoney attached to the 80 midweek and 10 Saturday Fillies and Mares races that will be held.

David died while competing in the Taupo 2.5km Epic Swim on Saturday afternoon. Aged 54 David was the immediate past chairman of the RACE Inc Group of Clubs and a Past President of the Manawatu Racing Club. He was a very well known and respected racing administrator, who had raced numerous horses with considerable success both here and in Australia, a number in partnership with his cousin Guy Sargent, the former Chairman of NZTR.

Reefton at Riccarton Park on 1 February 2012

The racemeeting to be held at Riccarton Park Racecourse on Wednesday 1 February 2012 will now be run under the auspices of the Reefton Jockey Club.

The New Zealand Racing Board approved the change of licence on Monday 16 January 2012.

The Canterbury Jockey Club has agreed to the transfer of the date to the Reefton Jockey Club to enable that Club to have a racing opportunity following the abandonment of its racemeeting on Wednesday 4 January 2012.

The programme will remain as published in the *Thoroughbred Racing Monthly* and South Island Racing Programme booklet in respect of ratings and distances but the Reefton Jockey Club, with the support of its sponsors, is able to announce that stake increases will apply to each race.

Racing turnover was up 10.2% (+\$2.59m) for the week, Racing Tote was up 7.1% (+\$1.61m) with Domestic tote up 1.5% (+\$232k).

Domestic thoroughbreds up 3.2% (+\$252k) with an additional meeting and 13 more races (+20%) with Kumara on Monday having been moved into this week. Consequently horse starts were up 12.0%, with field sizes 0.7 starters a race less than in the same week last year.

The Listed Marton Cup at Awapuni on Saturday was the largest betting race for the week with turnover (tote and fob) of \$265k, down 18.2% on last year (four less starters this year). Interestingly the Kumara Gold Nuggets still made the top ten for the week despite having been run on the Monday; at \$179k was down 35% on last year.
