### **Asian Racing Federation Welcomes Kentucky Lasix Ban**

The Chairman of the Asian Racing Federation, Dr Koji Sato, has welcomed the move by the Kentucky Racing Commission to eliminate Lasix.

Dr Sato said that the profile of Kentucky within USA racing is such that the decision by the Kentucky Racing Commission will hopefully encourage other States to follow its example. "In addition to being a great step forward for Kentucky itself this development carries the prospect of having wider influence in promoting drug-free racing in North America. Kentucky plays such a prominent role within US racing and breeding that I am hopeful that other States will follow the example which has now been set by the Kentucky Racing Commission."

"It is the Asian Racing Federation's strongly-held belief that drug-free racing is essential. Ensuring the welfare of our horses, achieving a level playing field for competitors, keeping the trust and confidence of the public, protecting horses and jockeys from injury, promoting the strength and soundness of the breed these are all very powerful considerations and they all point in the one direction, namely that horses must race free from the influence of medication."

Overall turnover was up 20.7% (+\$5.24m) last week on the same week last year, +4.9% season to date. Racing turnover was up 14.7% (+\$3.13m) for the week, with Domestic racing turnover up 25.7% (+\$2.58m).

Domestic thoroughbreds turnover was up 23.2% (+\$1.11m) (tote + fob) with one additional meeting and eight extra races (+18.6%) with horse starts up 24.0% (avg. field size up 0.4 starters a race).

Note: NZRB supplied On-course Turnover total represents On-course turnover placed on NZ thoroughbred meetings from all on-course venues.
