Des Friedrich Appointed to NZTR Board

Experienced Racing administrator Des Friedrich has been appointed to the New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing Board.

Mr Friedrich has spent 33 years working in the racing industry here and in Australia and for the past year has lived in the Taranaki, where he is a Director and General Manager for Tuscany Construction NZ Ltd, which is the licensee for Platinum Homes.

Peter Francis, Chairman of the New Zealand Members' Council, said that Des Friedrich was appointed from a strong list of candidates that had put their name forward to fill the vacancy on the NZTR Board following the resignation of Dean McKenzie late last year.

Des Friedrich said that he was looking forward to making a positive contribution to the New Zealand Racing industry. Friedrich served seven years as an Executive Director on the Australian Racing Board while CEO of the racing industry in the Northern Territory of Australia and was the Chief Executive of Hawke's Bay Racing from 1988 to 1996.

NZTR Chairman Matthew Goodson said he welcomed the appointment of Des Friedrich to the Board, given his extensive industry knowledge, marketing and management experience.

Southland RC – Saturday 18 February - Stake Increases

The Southland Racing Club has confirmed that the **Invercargill Gold Cup**, Open Handicap, 2600m will now be run for an increased stake of \$25,000 at its racemeeting on Saturday 18 February 2012.

The stake for the **Southland Guineas**, 3YO, 1600m, has also been increased to \$47,750.

Cambridge JC Trials – Re-Scheduled to Thursday 23 February

Following consultation between Cambridge JC, the Northern Regional Programming Committee and NZTR, the trials previously programmed for Cambridge on Tuesday 21 February 2012 have been re-scheduled to now be run on Thursday 23 February. Nominations close with the national Racing Bureau at 12 noon on Wednesday 22 February.

This change has been deemed necessary as a result of a lack of availability of barrier staff on the originally programmed date.

Racing turnover was <u>down</u> 1.6% (-\$413k) for the week, Racing Tote was down 4.4% (-\$1.02m) with Domestic tote down 2.6% (-\$344k).

Domestic thoroughbreds turnover was <u>down</u> 5.1% (-\$386k) with the same number of meetings and races and just four more horse starts (+0.7%). The Group 1 J & N Berkett Telegraph Handicap at Trentham was the largest betting race for the week with turnover (tote and FOB) of \$628k. This was down 33% on last year (\$934k).

FOB Racing was up 23% (+\$602k) last week (up 23% or \$444k domestically).
