From the Horse's Mouth

On Monday night I attended a committee meeting of the hard working Wanganui Jockey Club, who along with Waipa, have been the most affected by strategic changes to Saturday race dates in the upcoming season. We really do understand the disappointment of these hard working committees regarding the loss of Saturday fixtures which will be moved to more strategic tracks.

It is not a pleasant thing to be the breaker of bad news, but the Board and I are committed to doing all we can to turn around what has been a gloomy outlook for thoroughbred racing by implementing positive strategic change. Change is never easy, especially when it affects such hardworking and passionate people.

This week, all Racing Clubs received a draft funding policy and confirmation of their race meeting classifications for the upcoming 2013-2014 racing season. This written notification was followed up with a series of telephone conference calls between NZTR and all race clubs on Tuesday.

Some of the detail confirmed in the policy flows on from meetings held in May with major race clubs, key stakeholder groups and cluster managers regarding the strategic direction of NZTR in advance of the Strategic Plan being finalised.

Meetings have been arranged around the country to enable all race club officials and committee members who are interested in hearing more from NZTR on its strategic direction. At these meetings we will engage with race clubs on NZTR's strategic direction in advance of it being finalised.

One of the discussion items is that NZTR is introducing a new hierarchal structure of race meeting categories, with a focus on lifting prizemoney levels at the top 20 "premier" race meetings and base prizemoney at all "feature" race meetings

Meetings begin at Awapuni on 8 July 2013 for central districts clubs, then Te Rapa 10 July, Auckland 11 July, Riccarton 16 July and Wingatui on 17 July. The Auckland meeting is the regular Northern cluster meeting so attendance of additional club committee members needs to be confirmed with the Northern Cluster chair.

These aren't public meetings as they are designed to provide the opportunity for interested race club committee members and race club management to hear and engage about the direction that NZTR is heading and the rationale behind it.

NZTR will conduct a full schedule of public regional forums around the country in September with specific dates and venues for these to be released shortly.

Innovation Early Estaronline Winter Cup Favourite

Multiple stakes winner Innovation was the only horse in single figures when TAB bookmakers opened a market in the Gr.3 Estaronline Winter Cup to be run at Riccarton on August 3.

Despite a last-start failure, the Keeper mare is the pre-post favourite at \$8 with stablemate Wanabefamous, I Am Sam and last year's winner Art Beat sharing the second line at \$12.

Thrive has opened up at \$14, a mark she shares with Seed Of Speed, and Khemosabi, Scapolo and Taurus are quoted at \$18.

Innovation has Listed wins in the Tauranga Classic and the Ag Challenge Stakes on her record and was runner-up in the 2012 Winter Cup.

Programme Changes

Ashburton RC - Maiden Race Change - Friday 5 July 2013

Following consultation between NZTR & the Southern Region Programming Committee there has been a further change to a Maiden race at the Ashburton RC race meeting on Friday 5 July 2013.

Was originally Maiden F&M SW 1200m (\$12K) became Maiden SW 1200m (\$12.5K) but is now Maiden 2YO+ SW \$12,500

The latest change has been made to offer a potential option for two-year-olds who were denied an opportunity following the deletion of the 2YO Handicap at the Waimate RC meeting on 28 June, and the fact that there are no other opportunities for two-year-olds in the region until late July.

Marton JC - Additional Race - Saturday 6 July

Following consultation between NZTR & the Central Region Programming Committee there has been an additional race added to the programme of the Marton JC race meeting on Saturday 6 July 2013. The race is:

Maiden Hurdle SW 2900m \$12,500
