Racing Integrity Unit – Casual Swabbing Officials Required in Central Districts Region

The Racing Integrity Unit Ltd commenced operations in February 2011 and is an independent organisation charged with managing integrity issues within the New Zealand racing industry. Bringing together Stipendiary Steward and Racecourse Investigator functions for the three codes – harness, thoroughbred and greyhound, the RIU is responsible for investigating and prosecuting breaches of the Rules of Racing.

The RIU is looking to build a pool of Casual Swabbing Officials in the Central Districts region for race meetings south of Taupo. This role involves taking urine samples from horses on course throughout harness and thoroughbred race meetings and completing required documentation.

The people being looked for will have a basic knowledge of racing, and will be experienced working with and around horses. Most importantly applicants will be able to demonstrate a high level of integrity and follow processes carefully.

These Casual positions are rostered with hours often outside normal business hours.

You will have energy, enthusiasm and a passion for the racing industry and a willingness to embrace change.

NZTR Handicapping Review – May 2012

In early 2011 NZTR instituted a detailed Review of its Handicapping policies and procedures. The Review identified a number of key changes that were formally adopted by the NZTR Board and implemented on 14 November 2011. The NZTR Board made a commitment to monitor the changes including six monthly reviews.

NZTR now invites submissions and recommendations from industry participants on any aspect of the Review outcomes and the changes that were introduced in November.

NZTR will also be consulting with various sector groups in May including the three Regional Programming Committees, Racing Clubs, NZ Trainers Association, NZ Thoroughbred Breeders Association, NZ Jockeys Association, NZ Racehorse Owners Federation and the New Zealand Racing Board.

As part of your response please provide any supporting statistics, comments or examples of your viewpoint. If you wish, you might also like to provide a response to the following questions:

- > Has the current NZTR Programming and handicapping system worked for you, and why?
- > What parts of the current system do not work, and why?
- What would you change, and why?

Amongst the handicapping/rating issues that have been already been identified are weight penalties for horses racing out of their class, horses being re-rated out of their class for placings and the order of entry into Open Group One races for 3YO's.

Turnover Information for the Period ending 6 May 2012

(1) Waipa RC; no equivalent meeting last year; this date was originally scheduled as a Counties RC meeting, but with the Avondale track not yet approved for racing there has been a shuffle of dates in April and May between Counties RC, Waipa RC and Whangarei RC to accommodate that situation.

(2) Otaki-Maori RC; no equivalent meeting last year.

(3) Whangarei RC; no equivalent meeting last year; was originally scheduled to be an Avondale JC meeting (see note 1 above).

- (4) Riverton RC; no equivalent meeting this week; Riverton RC raced Thursday 15 April 2011.
- (5) Hawke's Bay RI; no equivalent meeting last year
- (6) Canterbury Racing; 9 races this year, compared to 10 races last year.
- (7) Waikato RC; no equivalent Saturday meeting; Waikato RC raced on Thursday 5 May 2011.
- (8) Turbo Quaddie; turnover for this initiative last week was \$65,159.

Overall turnover was up 7.5% (+\$2.12m) last week on the same week last year.

Racing turnover was up 2.0% (+\$482k) for the week, with Domestic racing down 9.8% (-\$1.31m).

Domestic thoroughbreds turnover was down 12.3% (-\$866k) (tote + fob) with two additional meetings but three less races (-5.0%) with horse starts also down 14.4%.

Note: NZRB supplied On-course Turnover total represents On-course turnover placed on NZ thoroughbred meetings from all on-course venues. 'Total' NZ Thoroughbred turnover figure includes Off-course (including Pick 6), On-course (NZRB figure as commented above) and all Fixed Odds Turnover. All Turnover figures are supplied by the NZRB.
