ASHLEE MUNDY MEMORIAL JOCKEY'S CHOICE AWARD WINNER

South Island Apprentice Jockey, Courtney Barnes, won the inaugural Ashlee Mundy Memorial Jockey's Choice Award. Courtney is flying up to the North Island on 13 April and returns on the 18 April and is available for rides at Counties, Rotorua and Taranaki.

The Mundy family has kindly donated \$1,000 for this award for the next 10 years.

As part of her Award, Courtney receives a trip to Steven Ramsey's training establishment in Cambridge and will ride work for Lance Noble and Stephen Marsh.

Courtney was chosen by a panel of Senior Riders. Criteria for the Award includes overall performance on and off the track; ability and potential to go on to be a good jockey; manner on the track and in the jockey's room; dedication and enthusiasm.

'THEO THE THOROUGHBRED' SUPPORTS NZ RIDING FOR THE DISABLED

A children's storybook - 'Who can help Theo?' - has just been published by NZ Riding for the Disabled. The educational book is aimed at children aged 3-10. It tells the story of Theo, a retired racehorse, who loves people and wants a new job - but not just any job. This 24-page book introduces the reader to the world of Riding for the Disabled as part of a story brought to life by illustrators Dustys & Lulu and words by Belinda Jackson.

NEW RUNNING RAIL AT RICCARTON PARK

The new 'Mawsafe' plastic running rail was in use at Riccarton Park Racecourse for the first occasion at the racemeeting on Saturday 29 March 2014.

Widely in use on Australian tracks the rail has now been installed at Ellerslie, Pukekohe Park, Te Rapa and Riccarton Park as part of an overall project to roll these out to Strategic and Significant venues around the country. The Riccarton plastic rail was funded as a joint initiative between New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing, the Racing Safety Development Fund and Canterbury Racing.

Standing about 300mm higher than the previous 'Zincalume' rail its construction, materials and manner in which it joins together provides greater safety for horses and riders. Its benefits have already been experienced in an incident on Saturday 5 April when a horse gained access to the inside of the course without injury to it or rider and no damage to the rail.

Premier events such as the Melbourne Cup, the New Zealand Trotting Cup, New Zealand Galloping Cup, Wellington Cup, Karaka Million, Waikato Sprint, Auckland Cup, Harness Jewels and the Great Northern Steeplechase will continue to be broadcast on Prime.

MARLBOROUGH RC - SUNDAY 27 APRIL 2014 - SPECIAL CONDITION ADDED TO MAIDEN 2YO+ RACE

Following consultation between NZTR, the Southern Region Programming Committee & Marlborough RC a Special Condition has been added to the Maiden 2YO+ (1000m) at the Marlborough RC, race meeting on Sunday 27 April 2014.

The conditions of the race are now: Mdn 2YO+ SW 1000m \$8,000 \$5,000, \$1,600, \$800, \$400, \$200.

Special Condition: Any horse entered for this race which wins the Maiden two-year-old and upward race over 1000 metres at Waterlea Racecourse on Thursday 24 April 2014 will be eligible to start in this race and will be subject to a 2kg penalty for each such win.

Meeting details

- Woodville-Pahiatua RC Monday meeting was cancelled due to the surface being too firm to race on and an absence of an irrigation system at the venue. The equivalent meeting last season was abandoned for the same reason.
- Matamata RC Wednesday meeting was a Monday in late March last season, 8 races this season, 7 last.
- Otaki-Maori RC Thursday equivalent meeting was a Friday in FY13 with 9 races; this season's meeting hosted 8 races.
- Whangarei RC Friday meeting was transferred from Dargaville due to a dry track. This season the 6 races were run at Ruakaka, last season 7 races at Dargaville.
- Racing Te Aroha Premier meeting ran 9 races this season, 10 last season.
- Hawke's Bay RI Saturday meeting did not have an equivalent last year.

Turnover summary notes:

- Total NZ thoroughbred turnover is down 1.2% year to date.
- With 65 less races than run over the same period last season, turnover per race has actually increased, up 2.0%.
- Total starts made by thoroughbreds in NZ are down 566, 2.6% less.
- Average field size is up from 10.33 in FY13 to 10.38 in FY14, 0.05 starters per race (0.5%) more.
- The number of races with less than 8 starters is now 28 higher than a season ago.
- The decline in NZ thoroughbred totalisator turnover (down 4.3%) has been partly offset by an increase in FOB turnover (up 10.3%).
- \$NZ export turnover per race to 22 March is down (12.4%). The variance in the \$NZ/\$A exchange rate is responsible for a large proportion of this decline. The remainder, as well as the absence of any growth, appears to have resulted from the loss of coverage on Sky 1 in Australia for midweek races run after 2pm.
- (Note the last two weeks' turnover have been compared against Easter weeks last season)
