## FROM THE HORSES' MOUTH: NZTR CHIEF EXECUTIVE GREG PURCELL

We're off and running in 2014.

I've had the opportunity to attend a number of meetings in the past couple of weeks and I was extremely impressed by the quality of the events put on by the clubs. Big crowds and quality racing has been the hallmark of the start of a busy start to the year, which all bodes well for the rest of the season.

Country clubs nationwide play a hugely important role in racing and it's thanks to the hard work of committed club people that these festive events such a success. Many New Zealanders will attend race meetings this summer - some for the first time - and it's important we give them a great experience to make sure they come back. On that note, it's timely to compare key metrics from the first week of the year with the same period last year.

Across the board things have gotten off to a strong start and our job now is to make sure this continues on throughout the season.

### WEIGHTS AND CONDITIONS EARLY ENTRY HANDICAPS

NZTR in consultation with the Regional Programming chairmen and the New Zealand Trainers' Association has determined that should weights for any of the following six early entry races need to be increased at withdrawal time, the handicapper will not re weight these early entry races as is now

provided under Standard Regulation 8.3(a) because the nominations for these races closed prior to the new Standard Regulation being introduced on 13 December.

Weights for the six early entry races will be issued as was provided under the Standard Regulations at the time of entry, with a 59kg minimum topweight.

Should the weights need to raised at withdrawal time, they will be increased to provide for a 58kg minimum topweight, as was previously required under the Standard regulations, with the weights allocated to the horses comprising the remainder of the field adjusted accordingly at that time. For example, all weights may be raised by 1kg.

This departure from the new Standard Regulation 8.3(a) will apply to the following races:

- the Barfoot and Thompson Auckland Cup (Ellerslie, March 5, 2014)
- J & R Berkett Telegraph Handicap (Trentham, 18 January 2014)
- Platinum Homes Wellington Cup and Harcourts Thorndon Mile Handicap (Trentham, 25 January)

#### TERMINATING THOROUGHBRED PICK6 THIS SATURDAY

The Thoroughbred Pick6 is **Guaranteed to \$100,000** and **Terminating** on the last six races of the **Marton Cup Day** meeting at Awapuni Racecourse, Palmerston North.

The reason for the Terminating Pool is that the following week the **\$1 Million Guaranteed Triple Trio** kicks off on the last three races at the Saturday Thoroughbred Premier meeting, which starts with **Telegraph Handicap Day** at Trentham on January 18, followed by **Wellington Cup Day** at Trentham on January 25.

### **AVONDALE JC STAKE INCREASE: MONDAY, JANUARY 13**

### **CANTERBURY JC VENUE CHANGES IN EARLY 2014**

With work on the second stage of the Riccarton Park drainage project commencing immediately following the club's Christmas at the Races meeting on December 6, the Canterbury Jockey Club will not be racing at Riccarton in the first part of next year.

NZTR, in consultation with the Canterbury Jockey Club and the NZ Racing Board, has confirmed the following licence/venue changes:

- 1. Saturday 25 January 2014: Canterbury JC at Riccarton becomes a Canterbury JC licence at Ashburton
- 2. Wednesday 29 January 2014: Transfer Canterbury JC licence to an Ashburton RC licence at Ashburton
- 3. Monday 10 February 2014: Transfer Canterbury JC licence to an Ashburton RC licence at Ashburton
- 4. Friday 21 February 2014: Transfer Canterbury JC licence to a South Canterbury RC licence at Timaru on Sunday 23 February (note: this will become a dual code race day in conjunction with the Timaru HRC)
- 5. Thursday 6 March 2014: Canterbury JC proposed venue change to be confirmed

- Total NZ thoroughbred turnover is down 2.8% year to date.
- With 60 less races than run over the same period last season, turnover per race has actually increased, up 1.6%.

- Total starts made by thoroughbreds in NZ are down 540, 3.7% less.
- Average field size is up from 10.51 in FY13 to 10.58 in FY14, 0.07 starters per race (0.7%) more.
- The number of races with less than 8 starters is 15 higher than a season ago.
- Decline in NZ thoroughbred totalisator turnover (down 5.7%) has been partly offset by an increase in FOB turnover (up 8.0%).
- \$NZ export turnover per race to 31 December is down (14.5%). The variance in the \$NZ/\$A exchange rate is responsible for 10.7% of this decline. The remainder of this decline (3.9%), as well as the absence of any growth, appears to have resulted from the loss of coverage on Sky 1 in Australia for midweek races run after 2pm.

Note: Meetings, races, starters and turnovers are totals of NZRB supplied meeting by meeting turnovers. Off-course turnover is totalisator and FOB combined. On-course turnover is totalisator and FOB racing combined, placed on-course at NZ thoroughbred meetings. Total NZRB racing turnover is NZ thoroughbred, harness, greyhound and all imported racing turnover; total NZRB turnover also includes sport. NZ thoroughbred export turnovers are now included, up to the most recently available meetings. All turnover figures are supplied by the NZRB, derived from various sources.
