From the Horse's Mouth

The Handicapping review has now concluded. A new, and we are confident, more improved process should resolve the complaints raised about inconsistencies. There is a new policy with a national weight scale template in place. The template provides a guide to the weight that each horse will carry in a Ratings based handicap race based on the rating of each horse. The Handicapping Guide is available on the NZTR website.

We have appointed Bruce Sherwin and Mark Webby as handicap liaison officers as part of the complaints process. The important aspect is that stakeholders use the process which we are confident is robust.

NZTR is pleased to be hosting the high profile 2013 Asian Racing Federation Young Guns Series, which brings together the leading apprentice jockeys for a three race championship series to be held Saturday 17 August at Te Rapa racecourse at the Club's Waikato Stud Foxbridge Plate meeting.

An invitation has been extended to Racing Victoria, Hong Kong, South Africa, Japan, Macau, South Korea, Malaysia and Singapore to nominate one of their leading apprentice riders to compete here in August, alongside our own New Zealand representative. This event brings together the best young riders in the Asian Racing Federation region.

Dean Nowell, NZTR Chief Handicapper, to Retire on 31 July

New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing's (NZTR) Chief Handicapper, Dean Nowell, is to retire from NZTR on 31 July 2013.

NZTR Chief Executive, Greg Purcell, stated: "Dean has been a senior and highly respected figure in handicapping both in New Zealand and overseas and he will be missed."

"As part of NZTR's recent review of its handicapping processes, Dean was asked to relocate to Wellington. Due to his personal circumstances, Dean chose not to relocate and instead decided to retire from NZTR. NZTR wishes him well for the future."

Nowell has worked as Handicapper in New Zealand since 1981 when the handicappers were employed by the Clubs, prior to NZTR taking over the responsibility of contracting the handicappers

He is also the longest serving member of the International Handicapping Panel, which meets annually to determine the World Thoroughbred Rankings. He has also represented New Zealand on the ANZ Handicappers Panel for more than 20 years.

'Kiwi Bred' to Air in Dubai

The first series of 'Kiwi Bred' has been successfully sold to the Dubai Racing Club for broadcast on the Dubai racing channel. This further proves the quality and content of the series and showcases the New Zealand thoroughbred breeding industry on the world stage.
