TAB put a Hefty \$500k Turbo Boost on Saturday's Races

Spring Racing season officially kicked off last weekend, and just 7 days into it the TAB comes to the table with a massive \$500,000 Terminating Turbo Pick6.

The final leg is scheduled to run just 70 minutes after the first. The first leg jumps at 3.36pm and everything should be tied up by 4.46pm.

Whilst a Turbo is always quick, Saturday's Terminating Turbo Pick6 will be staged across all 3 domestic gallop meetings at Ellerslie, Wanganui and Riccarton - and for the first time you can take your bet for the Pick6 by purchasing your ticket today.

Strong New Zealand Interest in Australia Tomorrow

Prominent NZ gallopers Ruud Awakening, Cauthen, Veyron, Sacred Falls and Fast Dragon all race in Australia tomorrow as spring racing is well under way.

Meanwhile in New Zealand the first race for the new season 2 Year-Olds takes place at Wanganui, along with the likely clash of top rated fillies Recite and Orbity.

At Ellerslie the Great Northern Hurdles and Steeplechase takes centre stage.

Sprightly Mufhasa in Great Shape

Veteran sprinter-miler Mufhasa continues to surprise trainer Bruce Wallace with his energy and zest for work.

The nine-year-old was a runaway winner at the Avondale trials on Tuesday to put him in the frame for a range of options both at home and away to add to his collection of 10 Group One titles.

"I've never in all my years – and I've had a few good ones – had a horse like him that loves trackwork so much," Wallace said.

"He strides to the track and back and can't wait to work – I can't see any reason why he can't carry on racing at Group One level. His joints are the best they've been since I've had him and leg-wise and feet-wise he's great."

Scratched from the Group 1 Makfi Challenge Stakes due to the heavy track at Hastings, Mufhasa was given a run at Avondale and breezed home by 10 lengths over 1200 metres.

"It would have been great to be at Hastings, but the track was never going to come back and it was better that we weren't there," Wallace said. "He went great at the trials and didn't get off the bridle – Leith (Innes) said he had a little blow and all he needs is a good track.

"We've got a bit of difficulty in getting him started off over 1400 metres and there's the Windsor Park or the George Main at 1600 metres first-up.

"The other option is to wait for the Rupert Clarke over 1400 metres at Caulfield a week later, but the only problem is that he'd probably get 58.5kg in a restricted handicap and be giving a lot of weight away.

"Then there's the Crystal Mile at weight-for-age at Moonee Valley and he could come back for the Captain Cook. There's no doubt in my mind that he's competitive at Group One level and we just want to run him on the best track."

Thoroughbred Breeding Show Returns

The programme showcases New Zealand's thoroughbred breeding industry and takes an inside look at the people who make it happen.
